Hi, my name is Jodie Houltram and I am the Donor Recruiter/ Apheresis Coordinator for Tauranga.

I have been doing this role for just over 5 years, with a small break last year to have my first child. I love my job, I get to meet some great people and as my role consists of picking up groups to come in and donate blood, I am able to get outside and enjoy the beautiful Bay of Plenty weather.

My job consists of 2 roles:

A large part of my job is working with my regular Partners for Life groups, organising them every 3 months to let their staff out for an hour or so to come in and donate as a group.

And as we are always looking for new businesses to join Partners for Life, I am always on the lookout for businesses and groups that want to give something back to the community. I find the best way to get new businesses/groups on board is to talk to the donors that come into our rooms and get them involved in helping recruit their workmates.

Our coordinators make the world of difference when it comes to getting groups in, and we are always so grateful when staff are allowed out to donate.

I also go into businesses and do presentations at staff meetings, or set up What's My Type events so staff can find out what their blood type is and we can answer any questions they may have.

New Travel Tool

Travelling is often described as a 'rite of passage' for Kiwis, so New Zealand Blood Service (NZBS) has created a 'Donating After Travelling' tool to help inform you of when you can next donate blood after returning from your overseas trip.

NZBS is committed to ensuring a safe and secure blood supply for all New Zealanders, which is why there are strict protocols in place for donating blood after you have visited other countries.

Some countries carry a greater risk of exposure to certain diseases which can result in symptomless infection(s) that can be transmitted through blood transfusion. Because of this, if you have travelled to certain countries, please check the 'Donating after Travelling" tool before your next donation.

The 'Donating After Travelling' tool can be found on the NZBS website where you can enter in the country you have recently

visited, or click on the world map, to determine if there was an infection risk in the country you visited.

If the tool determines that you are not eligible due to your

recent travel. vou will be advised how long you should wait before donating next.
