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Baxter (Christchurch)

Baxter is an international healthcare company whose products and services save and sustain lives around the world. Globally, Baxter has over 50,000 employees and its New Zealand operations began back in 1980.

Ten pharmacy staff from the Christchurch facility recently decided to donate blood through Baxter's staff volunteering programme. Christine, Baxter's donation group co-ordinator, talked to us about the experience.

'NZ Blood Service kindly provided a bus to shuttle us in groups to and from their modern Christchurch Donor Centre. Donor Recruiter Jane, our driver for the afternoon, filled us in on information we needed to know before

donating. Some of us were first time donors. On arrival we were taken through the paperwork, given a finger prick test to check our iron levels, then went over to very comfortable bed-like chairs to give blood. All the staff were very friendly and professional. After our donation we had a little rest and then enjoyed refreshments and biscuits. Barbara, a New Zealand Blood Service volunteer, took care of us, supplying us with plenty of drinks and snacks. We all felt we had done something worthwhile.'



Dunedin City Council

Suzanne Donaldson, Blood Donor Coordinator at Dunedin City Council (DCC), talks about why she donates and how she encourages her colleagues to do the same.

"I have been donating regularly with the Dunedin City Council group for the past eight years, originally donating whole blood. My dad got sick in 2012 and needed plasma and platelets. I saw the difference it made to him, so I was glad to find out that I was eligible to become a plasma donor.

Back in 2013, I started organising DCC group donations. I have signed up a number of new donors over the years and the majority of them have progressed onto plasma donations. NZ Blood Service supports workplace co-ordinators very well with leadies and

It can be a challenge to sign people up for various reasons. The biggest hurdle is finding the right times for people to donate. I try to book our sessions around lunchtime to make it easy as possible for my colleagues. We also have a large proportion of people from the UK [who are ineligible to donate]. I just had a colleague tell me that if they could donate blood without a needle involved then they would gladly donate!

We have had some good news stories too. Some members of staff weren't good with needles, but conquered their needle phobia to support friends and family who were sick.

Dunedin City Council is very good at supporting blood donation, letting people have time away from work, with their manager's permission, to give blood.
